

# COLON CANCER IS BOTH PREVENTABLE AND TREATABLE. IF YOU ARE 50 OR OLDER, TALK TO YOUR DOCTOR ABOUT WHEN AND HOW TO BE TESTED

Make time for cancer screening. Colon cancer starts as a growth (polyp) in the large intestine (colon) or rectum. Screening tests find polyps so they can be removed before they turn into cancer. Tests can also find cancer in the early stages when it is easier to treat.

- Screening is recommended for everybody aged 50 and older
- You don't have to have a family history of colon cancer to be at risk
- The risk of colon cancer increases as we get older
- Colon cancer often has no symptoms
- Many insurance plans cover colon cancer screening
